# What are the barriers to LGB+ women with cervixes accessing cervical screenings?




#### The myth that they don't need one!

 40.5% of LGB women of an eligible age have been told they don't need screening because of their sexual orientation -LGBT Foundation, 2013

### Anxiety around healthcare settings

"Came out to my nurse - she kept asking about contraception and sex so I had no choice but to tell her. When I told her she was very rude and tried to get me out of the treatment room as soon as she could." – Megan, 38

"I went for a cervical screen test and was asked if I was sexually active. When I said yes I was asked if I was trying for a baby. When I said no, I was asked what contraception I was using. When I said none, I had to endure a 10 minute tirade about how irresponsible I am." - Anne

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- Better education for all parties
  - Challenging the myths around STIs for women and countering the belief that LGB women don't need a cervical screening
- More inclusivity in primary healthcare particularly around the language we use and perceptions of sex
