# Wheelchair users and people with limited mobility

When they have received their invite letter, women (or trans men) should contact their local screening unit to discuss their access requirements.

The number can be found on the invite letter. When they cannot be screened at their local unit - they will be referred to their local hospital and the mammography will be carried out there.

# Wheelchair users and people with limited mobility

When they have received their invite letter, women (or trans men) should contact their local GP surgery to discuss their access requirements.

If the GP surgery are unable to provide cervical screening at the surgery, they will refer those women (or trans men) to their local hospital Gynaecological Unit. The screening will be carried out there.
